Animals on Campus a. Service and emotional support animals assisting persons with disabilities are welcome, except for birds, amphibians and reptiles. People are limited to one service or support animal per visit. The staff is directed to work with their owners, if necessary, to minimize disruption of programs. Owners must ensure their pets are housebroken and do not mark indoors before being allowed inside church facilities. They must ensure the pets only relieve themselves or mark in appropriate outdoor spaces on church grounds. If the pet relieves itself indoors or outdoors, the pet owner is required to remove the waste. b. Pets other than certified service and emotional support animals must remain outside, leashed and in control of their owners, except when specifically invited for particular programs, e.g. pet blessings.</p>	<p>From Angela: P 40- the animal section. It seems like it belongs with accessibility rather than disruption. It's not clear what 'certified' means, and we don't ask for proof. Emotional Support Animals are in a nebulous category, but I have stopped asking them to leave.</p> <p>Heather sent language to Melissa Falkenstern for possible additions or clarifications.</p> <p>From Melissa: The main thing is that ADA service animals are trained and must meet certain minimum requirements regarding behavior to behavior, but emotional support animals are just pets. So, specifying behavior means that way you have concrete reasons to ask a person to leave or not bring a specific animal back if they are not behaving.</p> <p>Moving this section from the disruptive behavior section to section 7, which is about the use of church facilities.</p> <p>Faye will check insurance policy.
